Feb 12 **Fractal Lumination**

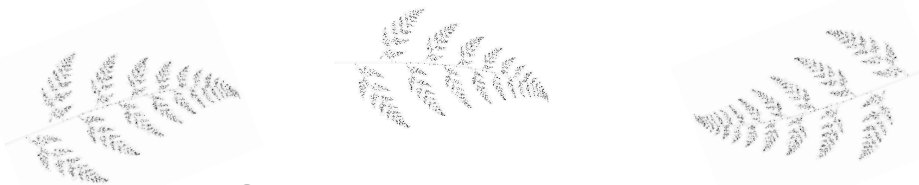
Movie. Fractals have been called the border between order and chaos. Enjoy this multimedia presentation of fractals set to music by various composers. They are geometric images based on the mathematical discoveries of Dr. Benoit Mandelbrot, who revealed a new geometry and an understanding about the patterns and shapes of nature. Digital media director Jon Beau Lee has offered his expertise in computer animation in order to bring the shapes to life.

Feb 19 **Mythos: Our Eternal Selves**

Movie. Joseph Campbell introduces systems of yoga that grew out of mainstream India and shows contrasts the Eastern way of perceiving consciousness and the Western view. Campbell relates some of the religious practices which were developed to get in touch with that Self at the center of one's being, removed from and far greater than the little self of the personal ego.
